Moment of Mindfulness:

This week we learned about Zacchaeus:

Jesus went on into Jericho and was passing through. There was a chief tax collector there named Zaccheus, who was rich. He was trying to see who Jesus was, but he was a little man and could not see Jesus because of the crowd. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree because he knew Jesus was going to pass that way. When Jesus came to that place, he looked up and said to Zaccheus, "Come down, Zacchaeus, because I must stay in your house today".

Zacchaeus hurried down and welcomed him with great joy. All the people who saw it started grumbling, "This man has gone as a guest to the home of a sinner!"

Zacchaeus stood up and said to the Lord, "Listen, sir! I will give half my belongings to the poor, and if I have cheated anyone, I will pay back four times as much."

It was common at that time for taxes to be fraudulently collected making tax collectors unpopular. Here Jesus demonstrates his mission to "seek and save the lost" resulting in a transformation in Zacchaeus' desire for money to salvation & eternal life.
